

This year's theme—blending the past, present, and future—was reflected in every aspect of the festival, bringing together tradition and innovation in meaningful ways. Fort Gibraltar transported festivalgoers back in time with costumed interpreters and traditional demonstrations, bringing the legacy of the voyageurs to life. Beyond the gates of Fort Gibraltar, the present pulsed with energy as fiddle music filled the air, snow sculptures glistened under the sun and the stars, and echoes of HÉHO chants could be heard throughout the park.

Each day of the festival was filled with activities for all ages, from musical performances and cultural programming to snow-tubing, snow-skateboarding, and horse-drawn sleigh rides. Despite the brisk February winds, festivalgoers showed up in full force, reflecting the resilience that has carried our communities from 1815 to today.

Festival du Voyageur is more than just a winter celebration. It is a living expression of how we have maintained our language and culture from generation to generation. Each day of the festival offers an opportunity to pass on these traditions, ensuring that future generations remain connected to our history.

As we jigged, laughed, and gathered around fires with a maple taffy treat in hand, we celebrated where we have been, and where we are going. In every moment, we affirmed that our heritage, joy, and community can thrive—even in the heart of a prairie winter.

Once again, the various performances were excellent, and we enjoyed meeting new and old friends wherever we went.

We would like to thank the Festival du Voyageur team, including the Board of Directors and staff, for doing such a great job during this past Festival. A big thank you to the volunteers, artists, performers, and sponsors as this great celebration would not be possible without you. We appreciated the support of the Order of Official Voyageurs during our tenure. Thank you to our driver, Raymond Garand, who always kept us on time despite our busy schedule. 
